My momma always said "Life is like a box of chocolates you never know what you're going to get." This is one of the very popular lines from the movie **Forest Gump** (1994) which I'm sure that most of us have used from time to time. As you remember, this movie starred Tom Hanks as Forest Gump and our Knights of Columbus Fourth Degree Brother Gary Sinise, as Lieutenant Dan.

The reason that I started out with this popular saying is that we basically had the same volunteers in place doing the same work in 2023, as we did this year in 2024, but the results were completely different. While our Lenten Fish Fry Season in 2023 was successful for our Council, we started out with the first one being solid to steadily declining the next five Fridays.

This year we again started off with solid results then went up to the mid 450 dinners served range and held there the next five weeks! I'm sure the price that we featured this year at "All you can eat for \$12" was a major contributing factor in this success coming down from \$15 in 2023. We realized some very significant

cost reductions for the cod and the cooking oil that we use just to name a couple that enabled us to reduce the amount that we charged per dinner. Let's hope these costs hold for the future!

I am so very proud of our Council and our Ladies Auxiliary and extremely grateful for all the hard work that everyone did to make this Lenten Fish Fry Season the **BEST EVER!** Our Council set records for total dinners served, total revenue and total profit in one year! If you are interested in knowing what the actual numbers are I will be happy to share them with you but, you will have to attend our next Council Business Meeting on Thursday, April 11th.

I would like to shout out a great big **THANK YOU** and recognize all of our Brother Knights and Ladies who volunteered their time and made these six Fish Fry events an amazing success for our Council. Thank you and God Bless all of you!!!

Chaplain's Corner

HAPPY EASTER ALELEUIA

We had two wonderful Masses in Philippe Park with a lot of Knights joining Ken Seguin, Paula Moynihan, Tom Fitzpatrick, among many Knights and Ladies helping in hospitality and being Eucharistic Ministers. Past Grand Knight John and his wife Sharon joined. Once again John Ruckhardt was there at 5am to set up a near perfect sound system covering the wide spread of faithful in the park for Mass.

As part of my homily I talked about Cyrus Labib, now a Jesuit seminarian in his early 40's. He has accomplished a lot of things - Phi Beta Kappa at Columbia followed by a Rhodes Scholarship to Oxford, where he converted to Catholicism - in part due to his connection with the Jesuit Residence Campion Hall. Back to the States he enrolled at Yale Law School and was editor of the Yale Law Review. Back in Washington State, he practiced law and was elected to public office and eventually became the Lieutenant Governor, second in command of the State of Washington. During this time Cyrus also felt a growing call to become a priest in the Society of Jesus. He felt called by the Holy Spirit to discern whether he wanted to be "successful" in his various legal and political career or to follow his heart's desire and enter the Jesuits.

What I forgot to tell you was that Cyrus had eye cancer that left him permanently blind since the eighth grade!


I call Cyrus' blindness a real "death" to so many possibilities. Yet he appears to be very happy. I use this example of a fuller sense of Redemption. The Paschal Mystery affirms that out of the death and dying in everyday life, e.g. breakups of a relationship, loss of a job, disappointments big and small, et cetera, God opens up New Life, New Hopes, New Beginnings in amazing and unexpected ways. Another way to say that is that one door gets slammed in my face and is not going to open again, God, God will open up a New Door in amazing and unexpected ways. Or as my Jesuit friend Paul Macke says, "sometimes the deviation becomes the main road.

These Paschal Mystery Moments are not "magic." They demand our trust and cooperation and our not giving up or letting uncontrolled anger get in the way. Thus, we remain a people of Hope and possibility. Likewise, we are called to be those witnesses and ministers of that Hope and Possibility and, like Jesus, never to give up Hope on anyone, including God and myself.

Saint Catherine of Siena - April 29, 2024

One of the Church's great mystics, Catherine Benincasa had her first visions of Jesus when she was six years old. At seven, she vowed to give her whole life to God, and at sixteen she joined the "Mantellate," a local group of Dominican tertiaries, a gathering of pious women composed primarily of widows, informally devoted to Dominican spirituality. In later years, these pious groups would be formalized into the Third Order of Dominicans. A remarkable ascetic, Catherine was

sustained almost exclusively by the Eucharist, and both interceded for and admonished many hardened sinners who subsequently converted. received what she would call a "mystical marriage" with Jesus, which further fed her zeal, culminating in a successful exhortation of Pope Gregory XI to return to Rome from Avignon, and then carried out many missions entrusted to her by the pope, something quite rare for a woman in the Middle Ages. She engaged in papal and Italian politics through extensive letterwriting and advocacy. A constant advocate of the mercy of Jesus, she died April 29, 1380 exhausted by her rigorous fasting at the age of thirty-three. She was canonized in 1461 by Pope Pius II. She is revered as a Doctor of the Church due to her prolific theological authorship, and her strong influence in the history of the papacy. In 1999, Pope Saint John Paul II proclaimed her a Patron Saint of Europe.

Jesus Christ is Risen today! He is Risen Indeed! Happy Easter! Alleluia! Alleluia!! May the promise and hope of Eternal Life with God strengthen you and your family and friends to grow in faith and share the Good News.

As this is written, we await various Supreme Court rulings. Here in Florida, the FL Supreme Court is to rule, maybe this last week of March, on the proabortion amendment to our state constitution, whether it will be on the ballot in November. Nationally, the US Supreme Court is reviewing the FDA's rules on dispensing the abortion pill mifepristone. commentaries on this national case believe the Court will support the FDA authority. However, the CEO of the American Association of Pro-Life Obstetricians & Gynecologists, Dr. Christina Francis, states in a Wall Street Journal article (3-26-24) that "under the FDA's relaxed protocols, women are at a greater risk of a deadly ectopic pregnancy." My hope is that the government and medical profession change course to gather the health statistics on the abortion pill and abortion in general to present the dangers to all women, across all races and ethnicities. And may that lead, eventually, to better protection of the unborn.




Within one year, 35% of all US archbishops will be at least 75, the age when a bishop is required to submit his resignation to the Pope. Pope Francis can accept or defer action. These 12 bishops, who are nearing retirement include five Cardinals: Sean O'Malley, Boston (turns 80 this June), Wilton Gregory, Washington DC (turns 77 in December), Blaise Cupich, Chicago (75 – March 2023), Daniel Dinardo, Galveston-Houston (turns 75 this May), and Timothy Dolan, New York (turns 75 in February). Cardinals have voting privileges to select a new pope, up till the age of 80. That was established by St Pope Paul VI in 1970. Also, a 2/3 super majority is required to select a new pope.

- Poland's new government is considering legalizing abortion, under any conditions up to 12 weeks, and allowing the morning-after pill to be sold over the counter to minors age 15 and older.
- Catholic schools in America, overall, are still closing their doors: 44 in 2023, 71 in 2022, and 209 in 2021. And the percentage of Catholics in Catholic schools is dropping too: now 78%, it was 87% some 20 years ago, and 97% in 1970.

Spiritual State of the Union

Happy Easter! He is Risen!!! It's time to rejoice and take stock.

The readings from the Fourth Sunday of Lent, Laetare Sunday or "rejoice" reminded us of our failures and the need for salvation.

Our Catholic Church is organized on four pillars. It is One, a church founded by Jesus Christ and initially led by St. Peter. It is Holy based on the Scriptures and life of Christ. It is Catholic or universal. Finally, it is apostolic or assigned the mission of exposing and converting others to the truth.

Similarly, our brotherhood as Knights is also based on the pillars of unity, charity, fraternity, and patriotism. So, we're geared to support and live the pillars of our Church, the Mystical Body of Christ, as well as those of our country as our Creator was recognized as the author of our rights to life, liberty, and the pursuit of happiness.

Yet, despite those blessings, we can go astray as the Israelites seemed prone to doing despite their blessings as witnessed in Chronicles. "In those days, all the princes of Judah, the priests, and the people added infidelity to infidelity, practicing all the abominations of the nations and polluting the LORD's temple which he had consecrated in Jerusalem. Early and often did the LORD, the God of their fathers, send his messengers to them, for he had compassion on his people and his dwelling place. But they mocked the messengers of God, despised his warnings, and scoffed at his prophets, until the anger of the LORD against his people was so inflamed that there was no remedy. Their enemies burnt the house of God, tore down the walls of Jerusalem, set all its palaces afire, and destroyed all its precious objects. Those who escaped the sword were carried captive to Babylon, where they became servants of the king of the Chaldeans and

his sons until the kingdom of the Persians came to power. All this was to fulfill the word of the LORD spoken by Jeremiah: "Until the land has retrieved its lost sabbaths, during all the time it lies waste it shall have rest while seventy years are fulfilled."

You read that and think of how that applies to our culture today. We see the infidelities, abominations and mocking of the messengers of God in many ways. We are also warned of the results.

In the Gospel for Laetare Sunday, Jesus continued this them when He said to Nicodemus: "Just as Moses lifted the serpent in the desert, so must the Son of Man be lifted up, so that everyone who believes in him may have eternal life. For God so loved the world that he gave his only Son, so that everyone who believes in him might not perish but might have eternal life. For God did not send his Son into the world to condemn the world, but that the world might be saved through him. Whoever believes in him will not be condemned, but whoever does not believe has already been condemned, because he has not believed in the name of the only Son of God. And this is the verdict, that the light came into the world, but people preferred darkness to light, because their works were evil. For everyone who does wicked things hates the light and does not come toward the light, so that his works might not be exposed. But whoever lives the truth comes to the light, so that his works may be clearly seen as done in God."

Quite a verdict to say the least! We live in trying times. We are called to follow the light as apostles, brothers in Christ, and patriots. We have our work cut out for us. **OUR** State of the Union is strong!

From the Desk of Supreme Knight Patrick Kelly...

The Gift and Task of Unity

Knights are called to pray and work for the unity that Christ wills for the Church and our families

At a time when our culture and politics are more divided than ever, so too is there polarization within the Church. The Second Vatican Council declared that the Church is "a sign and instrument" of communion with God and of unity for the whole human race. But this truth is often hard to see. We should ask ourselves, as Catholics and as Knights, what are we doing about it? Are our attitudes and actions sowing unity or division?

Unity, together with charity, is one of the Order's first principles. At our founding, Blessed Michael McGivney stated that the purpose of the Knights is to "unite the men of our faith" in order to "gain strength and to be charitable." In our exemplification ceremony, a new Knight hears the Lesson on Unity, which affirms, "To increase unity in our Church and our families is one of the great missions of the Knights of Columbus."

It is Christ himself who bestows on the Church the gift of unity. Just before his passion, our Lord prayed for us: "that they may all be one, as you, Father, are in me and I in you, that they also may be in us, that the world may believe that you sent me" (Jn 17:21).

Through our baptism, each of us has a responsibility to pray for and foster the unity that Christ wills for the Church. The simple truth is that when we are harsh or habitual in our criticisms of the Church and its leaders, we are damaging the body of Christ.

Scripture reminds us of the power of our speech. The tongue can be "a restless evil, full of deadly poison. With it we bless the Lord and Father, and with it we curse men, who are made in the likeness of God. From the same mouth come blessing and cursing. My brethren, this ought not to be so" (Jas 3:8-10).

The Catechism of the Catholic Church (2477), meanwhile, warns against rash judgment, detraction and calumny, offenses against truth that cause a cascade of even greater division. On a personal level, our cynicism can lead us into a spiritual desert that extinguishes the joy and hope we are meant to radiate as Christians. Tragically, it may even give others, including our children, a reason to abandon the faith entirely.

All of this does not mean we should turn a blind eye to real problems, but it does mean practicing charity and showing respect, especially in disagreement. We also need to recognize the limits of our personal responsibility. Rather than focusing on things we cannot change, let's take responsibility for the things we can. And our primary aim should not be to criticize but to "build one another up" (1 Thes 5:11).

We should ask ourselves: Can we do more to help our parish and our pastor? Can we turn off the noise from social media and news outlets and turn toward the voice of Christ in silent prayer? Can we offer a rosary for the health of our marriage and our family or devote an hour to Eucharistic adoration for the strength of our priests, our bishops, and the pope? Prayer from the heart, far more than criticism, has real power to change things.

Christ shed his blood for his bride, the Church. We, as imitators of Christ, are called to love the Church and work for her good in thought, word, and deed. Christ himself reminds us, "Whoever is not with me is against me, and whoever does not gather with me scatters" (Mt 12:30).

Finally, consider that St. Joseph was the silent witness of the Gospel, yet his actions spoke eloquently of his fidelity to and unsurpassed love for Christ and the Blessed Mother. St. Joseph, guardian of the Redeemer and patron of the universal Church, pray for us!



Heavenly Father, thank you for the gift of our family. Enlighten our hearts and minds that we may live more fully this vocation to love.


In our daily life and work,
