Grand Knight Message Patriotism

Each 'degree' of the Knights of Columbus is associated with a particular virtue, the fourth being "Patriotism". Thus the 4th Degree is often known as 'The Patriotic Degree'. It was established in New York on February 22nd, 1900, and it is still the degree of secrecy ie: a third-degree knight will not be admitted in a fourth-degree business meeting.

The requirements for joining the 4th are that a brother Knight must have been a third-degree member in good standing for at least one year, be an exemplary Catholic, and be of sound citizenship of his country. The Fourth Degree is frequently regarded as an honorary title with its regalia of tuxedos, capes, chapeaux and swords, but should rather be thought of in terms of service to church and country,

and the goals of the Fourth Degree may be summarized as the promotion of the ideals of Catholicism and Patriotism side by side.

In more detail, these goals may be stated as: To promote and strengthen the patriotic spirit of the civic community. To educate its members, and others, both in the teachings of Holy Mother Church, and the history of our nation. To promote by example the highest type of citizenship so necessary for the preservation and perpetuation of Republican form of government, and its democratic institutions.

To oppose dissemination and spread of doctrine dangerous to our form of government, and to the Divine law of faith and morality. To support by word and deed, the duly constituted authorities of local, state and national government, and to recognize excellence in public life.

Therefore, it is not unusual to find Fourth Degree Knights participating visibly in church events, such as Eucharistic processions, funerals, and others, and in the community, standing up for the unborn and the elderly at Pro-Life events, and commemorating the sacrifices of previous generations on Remembrance Day.

Along with everything else going on in April, it is also Autism Awareness month. The Autism Speaks website (www.autismspeaks.org) contains much more information that I can give you here. Autism has been more widely discussed and better understood in recent years. Although the TV show "The Good Doctor" portrays a doctor who has autism, those with Autism Spectrum Disorder exhibit a broad range of characteristics. Many have much less functionality than the doctor portrayed on the show. I mention this because many of us know of someone who is on this autism spectrum. If diagnosed early in childhood and intervention begun, those with autism may still live a relatively normal life. However, many with autism struggle and have other complicating medical or psychological issues and need much support during their lives.

That's where the Knights of Columbus Family Fraternal Benefits may be able to help. The Family Fraternal Benefits cover a number of situations. One benefit addresses the child who is older than 60 days and younger than 18 and is uninsurable according to our ordinary underwriting practices. Many children with autism as a primary or secondary diagnosis fall into this category...uninsurable. For those children, the Order has a special family fraternal benefit that allows the issuing of an ordinary permanent life insurance policy on this uninsurable child. Some members may be unaware of this benefit, but it's great news for any parent with a child who does not qualify for life insurance. There are some other qualifiers for the parents and any other children in the family, including that the father must be a member in good standing in his council. I won't go into the others here, but this is a very worthwhile benefit, not only for those children with autism, but for any child who may be uninsurable.

If you know of a Catholic family that may have a child with autism or any family with a child who is uninsurable, please reach out to me. They may be unaware of this benefit. I will be happy to contact them explain this valuable protection that is available. If you prefer, give my name and contact information to that parent so they can contact me at their convenience. As always, there is never any requirement to purchase any product, but a consultation about this benefit may bring them some small comfort.

I told him that I tell the TRUTH and it may hurt, but YOU are a father right now. Your child is in her mom's womb and YOU are a father who has decided to kill his first born. That did it! He began to change his mind and I told him to go inside and get her out. This young man did try, but the clinic workers wouldn't let him speak

to his woman. He went back in and called her name. The clinic workers told him they would call the police if he came back inside again. Where is the choice in this situation? The abortion mill workers made the choice for him and her that their child was to be killed.

He was getting upset and I said, "Hold on, Bud. I have a plan. We can get some other girls going in there to look for her." Just as I said that, two girls were going past us heading in. I called to them, "Hey girls, this young man wants to pick up his game and take care of his woman and child. Could you look her up and relay his message?" We described her and the gals agreed saying they knew what room she was in because they remembered what she was wearing. The two girls went in and, in about 5 minutes, came out. One was crying. I asked her, "What's wrong?" She confessed to me that she wanted to keep her baby also. I gave both these moms a onesie for their babies. After a few minutes, the lady we originally were trying to rescue came out. We bought all three ladies a lunch before escorting them to the Women's Help Center.

Again, TRUTH won! We felt the love of Christ in our hearts. That feeling brings us all closer to God. The mother, the father, the counselors and the child. TRUTH will always win and the lies will VANISH....like chaff in the wind.



4 Chaplin's Assembly Dinne Held in March at Santa Maria del Mar

The Dorchester, a civilian liner, had been converted for military service in World War II as a troop transport of the War Shipping administration. The ship left New York on January 23, 1943, en route to Greenland, carrying approximately 900 as part of a convoy of three ships escorted by Coast Guard Cutters *Tampa, Escanaba*, and *Comanche*. During the early morning hours of February 3, the vessel was torpedoed by the German submarine U-223 off Newfoundland in the North Atlantic. The chaplains helped the other soldiers board lifeboats and gave up their own life jackets when the supply ran out. The chaplains joined arms, said prayers, and sang hymns as they went down with the ship.






