The Church dedicates the month of August to the Immaculate Heart of Mary. The devotion to Mary's Immaculate Heart emphasizes the purity, love, and maternal compassion of Mary, the mother of Jesus. The title "Immaculate" reflects the belief that Mary, from the moment of her conception, was free from original sin and fully united with God's grace. The devotion focuses on her interior life, her virtues, and especially her deep love for God and humanity, highlighting her role in the salvation narrative and her unique participation in the life of Jesus.

Historically, the devotion to Mary's Immaculate Heart gained prominence through various Marian apparitions and teachings. 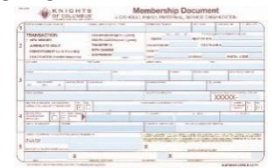

District 17 Organizational Meeting Kicks Off the 2026–2027 Fraternal Year

District Deputy Greg Gully (District 17) officially launched the new fraternal year with a district Organizational Meeting. The meeting was held on the first Monday of July at the SMdM Learning Center. The Grand Knights, Program Directors, and Membership Directors from Notre Dame Council 10514, St. Mary's Council 11961, and Mother Seton Council 17480 were in attendance. DD Gully led a number of discussions on the various Supreme Council programs and resources available to ensure successful implementation.

Faith in Action Programs

DD Gully announced several new Faith in Action programs that have been introduced this year, including 'Build a Bed', 'Remembering Our Faithful Departed', 'Gospel of Life', 'Imitating Saint Juan Diego', and 'Celebrating Our Catholic Heart Heritage'. It was explained how these programs offer councils additional opportunities to strengthen service to the Church, the local community, and Brother Knights.

Council Officer Training

District Warden Owen Thompson highlighted the advantage of using webinars to train the incoming council officers. Officers can sign-up for the Fraternal Leaders Advisory on the Florida State Council website to view videos about their individual roles.

Star Council Award

The district was honored to welcome Worthy Regional Administrator Bill Kelly, who provided valuable guidance on the new Supreme Council requirements and expectations for the 2026–2027 Star Council Award. RA Kelly outlined the requirements to qualify for the 2026–2027 Star Council Award. Every council must first remain in good standing with the Supreme Council, maintain Safe Environment compliance, submit all required forms on time, and complete Form 1295 (Annual Audit), which must be submitted by August 15th. Timely submission of all forms is key to helping ensure a smooth and successful fraternal year. He also pointed out that there are no changes to the requirements for the Father McGivney Award. Councils

must continue to achieve their assigned membership growth goals. The requirements for the Founders Award have changed. Rather than conducting Fraternal Benefit Events, councils must now have their Financial Advisor meet one-on-one with Associate Members. Depending on the size of the council, a minimum of five and a maximum of fifteen individual meetings will be required.

In addition, councils seeking Star Council must complete the following:

- ✓ Donate \$500 to one of the following Supreme Council initiatives: Aid & Support After Pregnancy (ASAP), Food for Families, Coats for Kids, or Refund Support Vocations Program (RSVP).
- ✓ Conduct one Faith in Action program in each of the four categories: Faith, Family, Community, and Life.
- ✓ Conduct a monthly COR Faith Formation Program meeting, appoint an Evangelization and Faith Formation (EFF) Director, and submit the required EFF Director form to Supreme.

If a council does not meet the monthly COR requirement, it must instead complete three unique Evangelization and Faith Formation activities, such as building fraternity among members, bringing men closer to Christ, or serving the parish and local community.

Councils should also be aware that a new SP-7 form (Columbian Award Application) will be introduced. It is already available for viewing through the Officers Online Forms section, although the complete version will not become available until January 1st.

DD Gully closed the meeting by pointing out that having an organization meeting early in the fraternal year is extremely important. District 17 has proudly earned recognition as an All-Star District for many years through the dedication and commitment of its councils. As the councils in the district begin this new fraternal year, working together in faith and fraternity, each individual council, as well as the district, can once again reach these same heights of excellence.

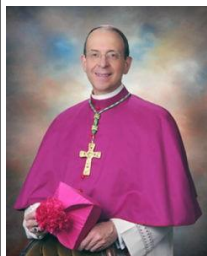

Supreme Chaplain's Challenge (August 2026)

A monthly reflection and practical challenge from Supreme Chaplain Archbishop William E. Lori



"He turned and said to Peter, "Get behind me, Satan! You are an obstacle to me. You are thinking not as God does, but as human beings do." (Gospel for Aug. 30, Mt 16:23)

Who knows the mind of God? God is beyond human understanding, yet he has revealed himself to us most perfectly in the person of Jesus Christ. Through prayer

we can come to know God more fully, and we grow in understanding of his plan when we make a habit of conforming our will to his holy will. We follow Christ in discipleship when we pray daily to the Father as he did: "Not my will but yours be done" (Lk 22:42).

This month, I challenge you to study the life and example of our founder, Blessed Michael McGivney, whose feast day is Aug. 13th. Use the Blessed Michael McGivney Cor Session Guide (freely available at www.kofc.org/shopcis), noting in particular how Father McGivney always sought to align his will with that of God.

Questions for Reflection:

- How can you strive to better understand things from God's perspective?
- How can you discern when your thoughts are merely human thoughts and not of God?
- What virtues of Blessed Michael McGivney can you imitate in order to submit yourself more fully to God's holy will?

Purpose and Principles

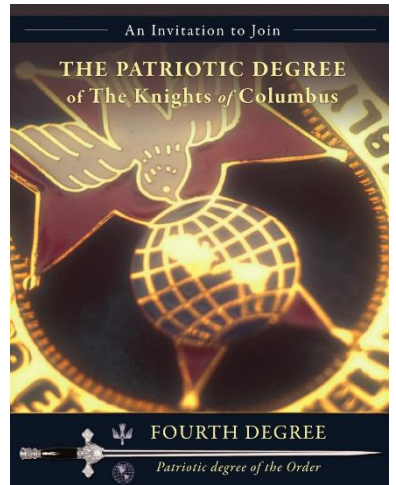

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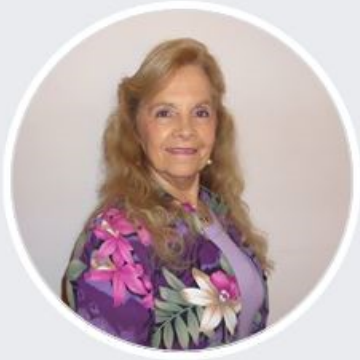
