Worthy Sir Knights,

Following is an article about the The Archdiocese for the Military Services, USA (AMS), holds a unique place within the Catholic Church, serving the men and women who protect our nation at home and abroad. Established as an independent archdiocese by Pope Saint John Paul II in 1985–1986, the AMS grew out of the earlier Military Vicariate created in 1917 during World War I. Unlike traditional dioceses with geographic boundaries, the AMS has

a global mission: to bring the sacraments and pastoral care to Catholics wherever they serve—on bases, ships, battlefields, embassies, and in VA hospitals.

Today, the AMS supports the spiritual needs of more than 1.8 million Catholics connected to the U.S. Armed Forces and federal service. Its chaplains—priests drawn from dioceses and religious orders across the country—provide Mass, confession, marriage preparation, counseling, and the comforting presence of the Church in some of the most challenging environments imaginable. The archdiocese also oversees Catholic ministry in 153 VA Medical Centers, ensuring that veterans receive compassionate pastoral care long after their military service has ended.

For the Knights of Columbus, the mission of the AMS resonates deeply with our principles of charity, unity, fraternity, and patriotism. Many of our councils actively support military families, chaplains, and veterans, recognizing the sacrifices made not only by those in uniform but also by their loved ones. As we continue our own work of service, we remember the AMS and its chaplains who bring Christ's presence to those who defend our freedoms. May we keep them in our prayers and remain steadfast in supporting the spiritual needs of our nation's heroes
