Happy 2026! Now the time change has occurred, we understand why we start Bingo at 1 vice 2, as we want to ensure our players (as well as our staff) get home before it gets dark. We welcome back our winter visitors! **We will take off Bingo for the ministry fair January 11, and again on February 1 for the Confirmation retreat.**

Kitchen upgrade is complete! While the griddle is available for cooking, the outside grill is preferred. The grill is in a standby location in the hall. It will need to be pulled out Sunday morning and put back in storage after bingo concludes in the afternoon. The nice thing is that folks smell the burgers and dogs cooking (and liked the aroma), cooks faster (more BTU's than the inside griddle), and is much easier to clean!

Bingo doors open at noon on Sunday, and first game starts at 1:00 p.m. The games currently last until 4 to 4:15, so it is not an all-day affair.

Please consider volunteering to help with Bingo. Brother Pasquale Volpe has lightened my load by organizing front table personnel, and **he could use some more brothers** to set up a rotational schedule. Just 1 and a half hours after the 10:30 mass on Sunday at Holy Redeemer. **We would also like to train an additional cashier.** It really isn't that challenging. Lead cashier needs to be there by 10:30 (to ensure they can get a parking spot), assist in setting up the cashier tables with early card sales help. Once the doors open, the lead cashier sells the game packs, and once the games start, divvy out the money for the winners, and is there to close the books when Bingo is over. Card sales can use some help, for 11:30 to 1 (contact Pat Volpe), and afternoon floor help from 1 pm to close.

All we are asking for is a commitment of a couple of hours per month. While I do sincerely appreciate those gentlemen who come in week after week, I am appealing to our other brother Knights. We have over 300 gentlemen in our order, yet fewer than 10 percent help on a routine basis. Please prayerfully consider using some of your time (and talent) to spread charity and goodwill to our biggest charitable event. Please help us keep alive the first pillar of the Knights of Columbus – Charity. Please let me know if you would like to help!

Operation Christmas Child “Shoeboxes”




