Bingo Update



Brothers:

We now begin a new fiscal year for Bingo. So how did we do compared to last fiscal year? We currently have one more week to go (as of this writing). Fiscal year 2024-2025 we averaged 74 players per week, generating nearly \$33,500 in gross bingo receipts alone. This fiscal year (2025-2026), we have an average attendance of just under 80 players per week, and have generated over \$51,300 in gross bingo income. That doesn't include the cost of the paper, use of the hall, etc., but all in all, it has been a great year, thanks to the volunteers and players who come each and (nearly) every week. This has allowed us to increase the donations to worthy charities to help put food on the table and take a bit of pressure off those who are less fortunate than us. And that does not include income from the kitchen.

Bingo will be in full swing every Sunday until the fall.

Bingo doors open at noon on Sunday, and first game starts at 1:00 p.m. The games currently last until 4 to 4:15, so it is not an all-day affair.

While we welcome a new Grand Knight and Deputy Grand Knight, I would like to welcome some more knights to help with Bingo. It isn't tough work, and the benefits of helping include fellowship with other Knights, meeting people, and interacting with a lot of folks who have very little family in the area. And as our first pillar of being a Knight, charity is one of the added benefits. Summertime comes with vacations with family. I get that. What we can use is a couple more volunteers. Not every week, just once or twice a month. Many of our brothers have dedicated themselves to helping our charities, and it is appreciated by not only me but our charities as well. But they deserve a bit of a respite. And as I have championed Bingo from the grave of COVID, I need to give my family some time that they have sacrificed as well.

All we are asking for is a commitment of a couple of hours per month. While I do sincerely appreciate those gentlemen who come in week after week, I am appealing to our other brother Knights. Please prayerfully consider using some of your time (and talent) to spread charity and goodwill to our biggest charitable event. Please help us keep alive the first pillar of the Knights of Columbus – Charity. Please let me know if you would like to help!

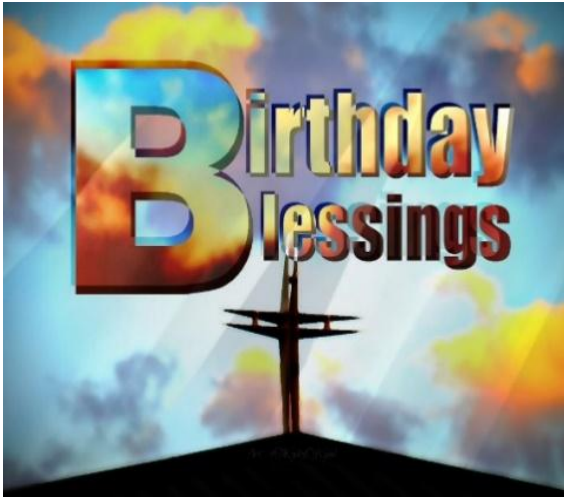

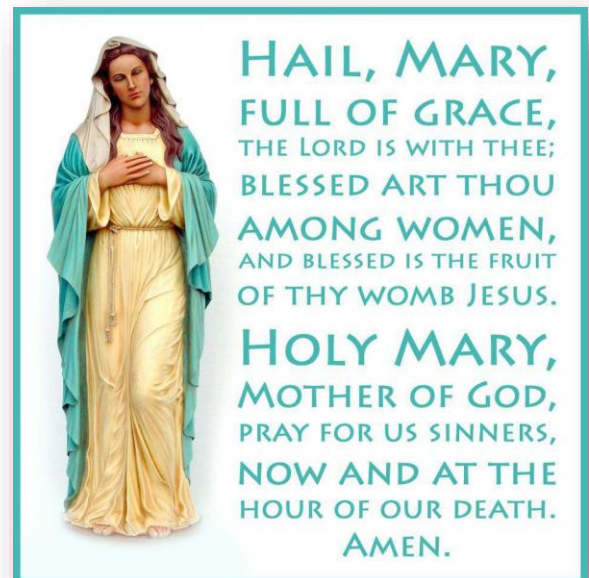
Culture of Life
