WILL THE REAL SISTERS PLEASE STAND UP !!!

As most of you know, my bride and I traveled to Phoenix for my Stepmother's funeral earlier this month. She was the last surviving member of the prior generation as many of the next three following generations were traveling to her funeral. As we look at familial generations, it can get out of whack at times. I am the oldest of eight and my youngest sister, the eighth, is seventeen years younger than I am; a generation.

My oldest daughter just turned 50 years old this year. While she was at the funeral, she once again told us how she felt more like the younger sister of my youngest sister as there was only eight years difference between them. That was not the first time that she had shared that fact with us, but it had a lot to do with her youngest sister who is twelve years younger than she is. When my oldest daughter went to the James Madison University, she was 17, and her youngest sister was 5. They were too far apart in age to really have anything to do with each other.

My youngest daughter just married her second husband earlier this year in Nokomis. It was a destination wedding as she lives in Iowa just across the river from Omaha. She is the Executive Chef at the Omaha Convention Center. My oldest daughter is also a Culinary Institute trained Chef who owned her own very profitable restaurant. The oldest has a reputation of not backing down from anyone and would negotiate (argue) her point of view very successfully more times than not. During the wedding, the Bride, the youngest daughter, was informed that the bar was going to close 90 minutes early, so she went to find the Chef of the hotel.

Immediately, word reached the older sister, who followed the Bride into the hallway between the banquet room and the kitchen. When she arrived in the hallway, she stopped to listen to her younger sister argue with the Chef of the hotel. After listening for a few seconds, she realized that her younger sister had everything well under control and she was not needed. A new relationship was just formed.

The sisters are both Chefs trained at stellar Culinary Schools and the older sister realized that the younger sister could hold her own. This defined the new relationship. Regardless of the difference in age, they had a new beginning based on mutual respect of having the same type of career, and seemingly, the same temperament. Up until this time, there had always been an older-younger sister relationship. That has now changed.

We saw the new relationship display itself at the funeral of my Stepmother in Phoenix. They now saw themselves as equals regardless of their age. They were peers. They found that they enjoyed each other as they had so much in common. From my perspective, they were like identical twins who really like each other. The result was a personal relationship that fed off each other constantly. I have never laughed so much or for so long as listening to those two banter with each other.

I have talked with many of you about our families and how they seem to change over time. I have finally experienced this first hand and it was well worth waiting for. My bride and I found out things that we never knew. We found out that the youngest daughter used to sneak back in the house at night by lifting the garage door a foot or two instead of coming in through the front door. I never heard her come in nor could I doubt her word when she told me that she was home early. We also found out that our oldest daughter used to have parties at the house when we were out of town. She found my secret marks about how much liquor was in each bottle, by erasing the mark I would put on, and put a new mark a bit lower on the bottle that I did. I never caught it.

I guess this is a blessing that we did not know all of the things that our kids did; just as I know I got quite a bit over on my parents when I was sneaking into the house after hours. This goes to prove that this good relationship that we have with our grown kids can actually improve. I am glad that our grandchildren were not there to see their mothers acting like school girls again.

Reflection on the Solemnity of the Ascension of Our Lord

“And behold, I am with you always, until the end of the age.” (Matthew 28:20)

“Christ’s Ascension is our uplifting.” — Pope St. Leo the Great

“The Ascension of the Lord is not his separation or removal from us, but rather the fulfilment of his mission.” — Pope Francis

As we have just celebrated the Solemnity of the Ascension of the Lord this past week, I thought that, for this Knights Newsletter, I would reflect on that Solemnity.

At first glance, the Ascension can seem like a departure story: Jesus returns to the Father, and the disciples are left behind looking into the sky. But the Church understands the Solemnity of the Ascension as far more than a farewell. In Acts 1:1-11, Jesus is taken from the sight of the apostles, yet this is not an absence but an enthronement. The risen Lord enters fully into heavenly glory and takes his place at the right hand of the Father. As St. Paul proclaims in Ephesians 1:17-23, Christ is raised above every power and dominion, and all things are placed beneath his feet. The Ascension reveals that Jesus reigns now, and that his mission continues through his Body, the Church.

Matthew 28:16-20 makes that mission unmistakably clear. On the mountain, the Lord tells the disciples, “Go, therefore, and make disciples of all nations.” The Ascension is not the end of Christ’s work; it is the beginning of the Church’s public witness. The apostles are sent, not in their own strength, but in the authority of the One to whom “all power in heaven and on earth” has been given. And they are not sent alone. The final promise of the Gospel is one of the most consoling in all of Scripture: “I am with you always, until the end of the age.” The Ascended Christ is not distant. He remains present in grace, in the sacraments, in his Word, and in the life of the Church.

For the Knights of Columbus, the Ascension speaks directly to our four pillars: charity, unity, fraternity, and patriotism. Charity flows from the truth that Christ reigns as Lord and calls us to be his hands in the world, especially toward the poor, the sick, the unborn, and the forgotten. Unity is strengthened because the Ascension reminds us that we belong to one Body under one Head: Christ himself. Fraternity deepens when we recognize that we are not isolated believers, but brothers sent together on mission, encouraging one another in faith and good works. Patriotism is purified and elevated by the Ascension, because while we love and serve our country, we also remember that our highest citizenship is in heaven, and our public witness must always reflect the kingship of Christ.

What, then, can Knights take from the Ascension? First, confidence. The disciples in Acts were told not to stand staring upward, but to prepare for the mission ahead. Knights, too, are called not merely to admire Christ from a distance, but to witness to him in family life, parish life, and civic life. Second, hope. The Ascension means that our humanity has entered heaven in Christ. He has gone before us, opening the way and interceding for us. Our labor, sacrifices, and fidelity are not meaningless; they are caught up in the victory of the Lord. Additionally, we can be sure that as Jesus has gone before us, we will follow; He has, as he promises in John 14, gone before us to prepare a place for us. Third, responsibility. If Christ is King, then every part of our lives must come under his lordship: our speech, our decisions, our service, our leadership, and our treatment of others.

In daily life, Knights can apply the truth of the Ascension in simple but powerful ways: by praying with greater confidence in Christ's presence, by leading their families with humility and faith, by serving those in need without seeking recognition, by defending the dignity of every human person, and by bringing Christian hope into workplaces, communities, and councils. The Ascension calls us to keep our eyes fixed on heaven without neglecting the work on earth. We do not look upward to escape the world; we look upward so that we can return to the world with courage. The Lord who ascended is the same Lord who sends us. And because he is with us always, every act of faithful service becomes part of his saving work in the world.

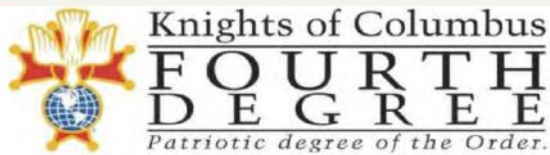

Memorial Day 2026.

After the Civil War, many citizens honored the memory of those who perished in the conflict by placing flowers on their loved ones graves during the month of May. Originally known as Decoration Day, the tradition was renamed Memorial Day in a National Proclamation by Major General John Logan who was the head of a large organization of Union Army veterans known as the Grand Army of the Republic in 1868. MG Logan designated May 30th as Memorial Day to honor those who died in the service of their country. As time moved on and our nation became involved in other conflicts, the fallen of those conflicts were also honored. In 1968 Congress passed the Uniform Monday Holiday Act which moved the observance to the last Monday in May.

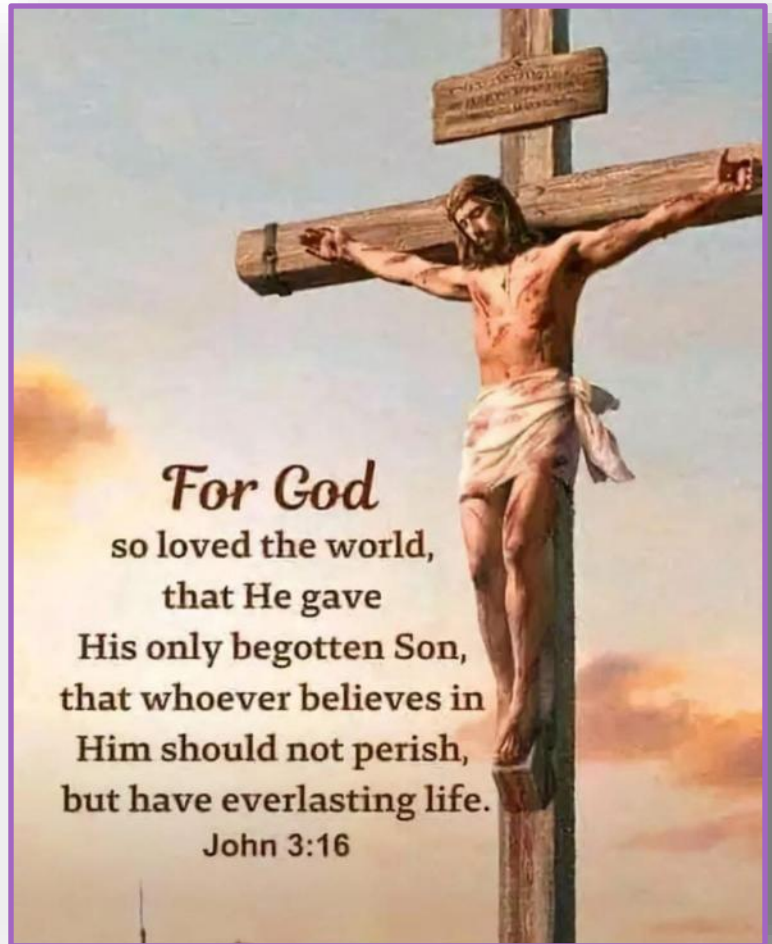

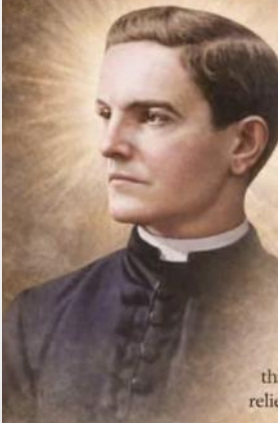

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A Tribute to Mary McGivney

This month of May is a good time to honor Father McGivney's mother, born Mary Lynch in County Cavan, Ireland. Part of the mid-19th-century migration to the United States during the island's potato famine, she crossed the Atlantic and settled in the busy manufacturing city of Waterbury, Conn. There she met Patrick McGivney, who also was born in Cavan and came separately to America, becoming an iron molder in a Waterbury factory. The two married in 1850 in St. Peter's Church (soon to become the present Immaculate Conception Parish), where their first child, Michael, was baptized August 19, 1852, a week after his birth.

Mary would give birth to 12 more children, six of whom died young. Neither of those numbers was unusual at a time when children were seen as a boon and a blessing and before the advent of antibiotics.

Though we have little documentary evidence from the life of Mary Lynch McGivney, we can infer the following:

- She had a devotion to the Sacred Heart of Jesus. A small Sacred Heart image was among the effects found in the McGivney home. The item is now on display in the Blessed Michael McGivney Pilgrimage Center in New Haven.
- She taught her children well. Her son Michael aced his elementary school exam and was advanced a few grades.
- She was as strong as she was pious. Giving birth to 13 and grieving the loss of six of them indicates heroic virtue by any standard. Her husband died in 1873, when Michael was 20, and Mary continued as matriarch of the family for another 15 years.
- Her prayers were powerful. All three sons who reached adulthood became priests, with the eldest on the path to sainthood.
- She was loved by the Blessed Mother. She died December 8, 1888, the feast of the Immaculate Conception.

Let us pay tribute to Mary McGivney's immense strength and quiet witness, while holding a firm hope that she is enjoying eternity with her beloved and blessed son Michael.

WWMD?

In the mid 1990's, if you wandered into any convenience store or supermarket in America, among the gum and candy and lighters and other impulse items at the checkout you would see an array of different-colored "WWJD" bracelets. The "What Would Jesus Do" phenomenon swept the nation, alongside Beanie Babies and The Macarena. Indeed, it was a thought-provoking statement, meant to bring to mind the moral example of Jesus. Unfortunately, what was lost was the divinity of Christ, his role as our savior, and the fact that we cannot always fully comprehend the important part: his "why" behind the "what."

WWJD missed the mark because it forgot the very important principles that Jesus is God and we are not, that his ways are not our ways, and that we think as man thinks not as God thinks. If only there was someone not divine, an earthly someone with human father and mother who lived a life of perfect virtue. Someone who is worthy of our imitation, whose "why" is clear as crystal, whose Life we can meditate on... Oh wait. We're Catholics. We know there is such a person: The Blessed Virgin Mary.

So, when we ask, "What Would Mary Do?", some of the answers are easy, because we know what she did. If the angel of the Lord comes and says to you that the Lord has chosen you for a special job, the answer is "let it be done." If a family member needs a hand around the house for a few months, the answer is, "let me go and help them." If your spouse is visited by an angel in a dream, the answer is, "I believe you and we'll do whatever the angel said." If you go to a wedding and they run out of wine, the answer is "I'll tell the only person who can fix the problem." And if your son is falsely accused and being put to death, the answer is, "I will not leave his side."

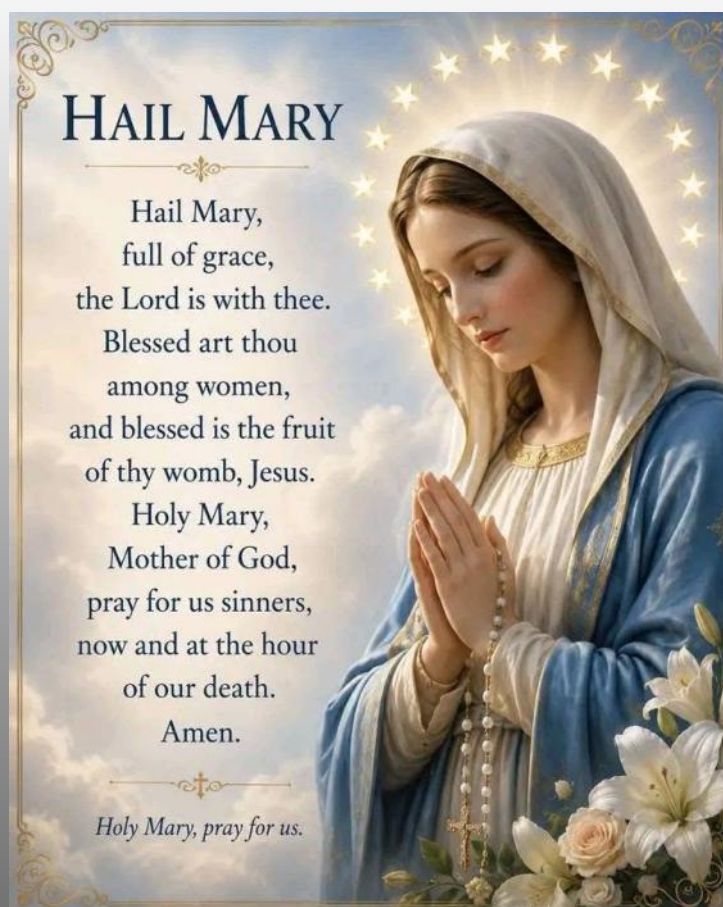
But WE can go further. We can meditate on other aspects of the phrase, "What Would Mary Do?", and in so doing we can discern her "why" behind her "what." It seems quite clear that it was her perfect fear of the Lord—one of the gifts of the Holy Spirit—from which all her actions flowed.

From this fear came her perfection of obedience to God, and it was from this obedience that God's graces filled her perfectly, making her truly worthy of being hailed as "full of grace." From her reverential fear of the Lord rather than fear of his just punishment came the perfection of her love for God.

And from this love for God flowed her devoted love for neighbor, whom she saw as a child of God just as she was.

In meditating upon "What Would Mary Do?" we find the reason why the Mother of God has come to visit her children on so many occasions. We can see why she came to St. Dominic to give him the Rosary, so that through it she can lead us to her son. We can see why she came to St. Juan Diego, to bring the Mexican people to Christ and put an end to pagan human sacrifices. We can see why she came to St. Simon Stock to give us the sacramental of the Brown Scapular, which we her children can wear with hope of salvation from eternal fire. And we can see why she came to three shepherd children in Fatima, to warn them-and all of us-about the reality of damnation, and to plead for us to stop sinning, pray and fast for the conversion of sinners, and pray the Rosary every day.

We face many temptations every day and every day we are also presented with many opportunities to live a life of perfect virtue. Every day we have the opportunity to live a life of fear of the Lord as Mary did and use that reverential fear to be obedient to God, and to love him above and before all others. All we have to do is ask the simple question: "What would Mary do?"

Pope Appoints New Bishop for Venice

VENICE, Fla. — Pope Leo XIV has accepted the resignation of Bishop Frank J. Dewane, 76, from the pastoral governance of the Diocese of Venice and appointed Capuchin Father Emilio Biosca Agüero as his successor.

The appointment was announced May 13 in Washington by Msgr. Većeslav Tumir, chargé d'affaires of the Apostolic Nunciature in the United States.

Father Biosca, a member of the Capuchin Franciscan Friars of the Province of St. Augustine in Pittsburgh, currently serves as pastor of the Shrine of the Sacred Heart in Washington.

Born Dec. 15, 1964, Father Biosca earned a bachelor's degree in philosophy from Borromeo College in Wickliffe, Ohio, in 1987. He later earned a master's degree in theology and a master of divinity degree from Oblate College in Washington in 1992. From 2004 to 2007, he pursued studies at the John Paul II Institute in Washington, earning a licentiate in sacred theology.

He entered the Capuchin Franciscans in 1987, made perpetual profession in 1991 and was ordained to the priesthood May 21, 1994.

Following ordination, Father Biosca served as a missionary in Papua New Guinea from 1994 to 2006. His assignments included St. Mary, Queen of the Friars Minor Parish in Kagua and the Pangia Capuchin Fraternity.

From 2007 to 2019, he served in Cuba at several parishes, including Cristo de Limpias and Jesús de Miramar in Havana, La Divina Pastora in Santa Clara and La Purísima Concepción in Manzanillo.

Since 2019, he has served as pastor of the Shrine of the Sacred Heart in Washington.

Bishop-elect Biosca speaks Spanish and Tok Pisin, a creole language widely spoken in Papua New Guinea.

The Diocese of Venice covers 9,035 square miles in southwest Florida.

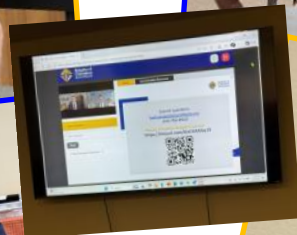
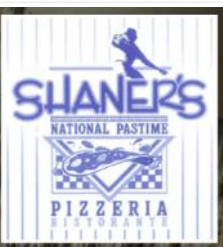
