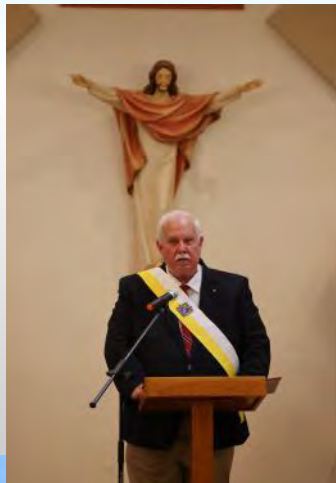
THANKS FOR THE MEMORIES

The Sacred Heart and the Knights of Columbus: One Mission, One Lord

What Is the Sacred Heart?

Devotion to the Sacred Heart draws us into the love of Christ made visible and personal. In the Sacred Heart we see the Lord whose love is sacrificial, merciful, and enduring. For Catholic men trying to live their faith in action, this devotion is not mere sentiment; it is a school of discipleship.

This devotion reaches back to the Gospel, especially to Calvary, where blood and water flowed from Christ's pierced side. Its modern form grew in the 17th century through St. Margaret Mary Alacoque, and it later spread throughout the Church through the encouragement of popes and the faithful. The Sacred Heart reminds us that the love of Jesus is not distant, but poured out for the life of the world.

Why does this matter for the Knights of Columbus? Because the Sacred Heart reveals the pattern of Christian manhood: turned toward the Father, open to others, willing to sacrifice, and steadfast in love. The four pillars of the Order—charity, unity, fraternity, and patriotism—are practical expressions of the love flowing from the Heart of Christ.

The Sacred Heart and the Four Pillars

Charity begins in the Heart of Jesus. In the Sacred Heart we see love poured out for the suffering, the forgotten, and the sinner. A Knight devoted to the Sacred Heart cannot remain passive before need, but learns to serve Christ in the vulnerable with generous love.

Unity also flows from the Sacred Heart. The Heart of Jesus gathers people together, drawing men from different backgrounds into one mission. Devotion to the Sacred Heart calls Knights to put aside rivalry and stand together for the good of the Church and the world.

Fraternity, too, finds its meaning here. The Sacred Heart teaches us to bear one another's burdens, support families in need, and remain close to our brothers in Christ.

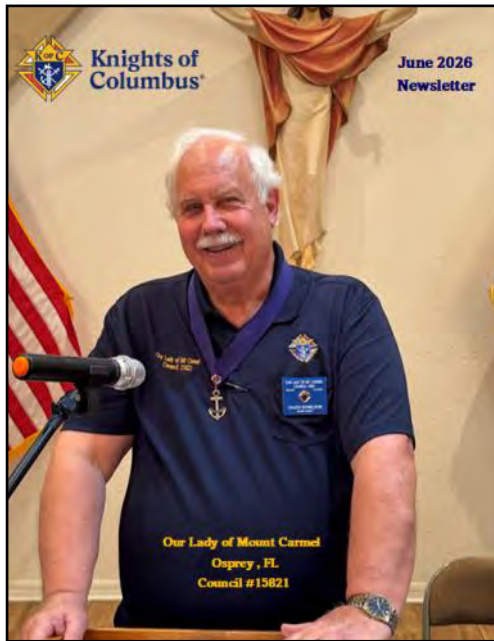
Finally, **Patriotism** is purified by the Sacred Heart. Love of country must be joined to truth, justice, mercy, and the dignity of every person. The Heart of Jesus teaches us to pray for our nation, work for the common good, and witness to the Gospel with courage and humility.

A Historic Moment — and a Call to Act

On June 11th, the Catholic Church in the United States consecrated our nation to the Sacred Heart. Therefore, this devotion takes on fresh urgency. It is a fitting moment for the Knights to renew our identity and mission in the Heart of Christ.

So, the challenge is simple: make one concrete response to the Sacred Heart this month. Spend time before the Blessed Sacrament, perform a hidden work of mercy, reconcile with a brother, or pray for our country. If the four pillars are to remain strong, they must rest on Christ's own Heart.

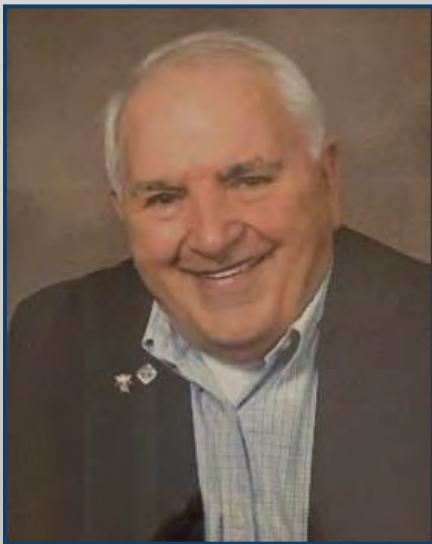
Building on the Success of our Brothers

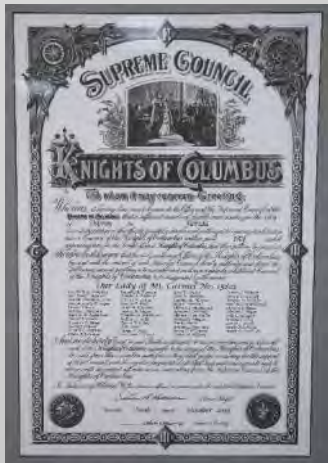

Heavenly Father, thank you for the gift of our family. Enlighten our hearts and minds that we may live more fully this vocation to love.

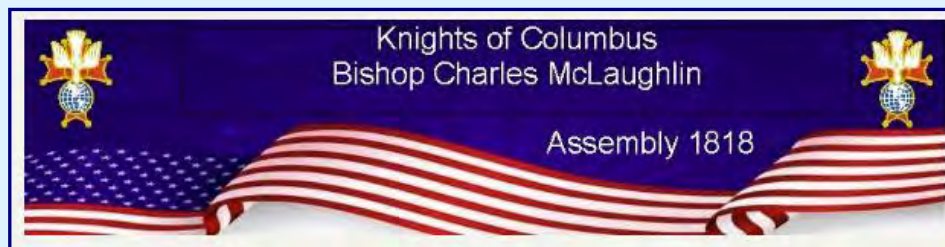
In our daily life and work,

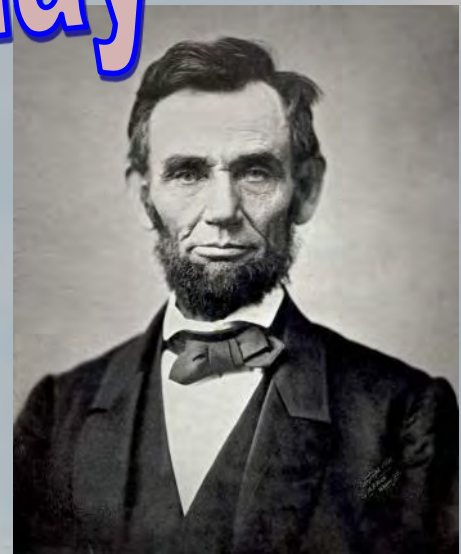
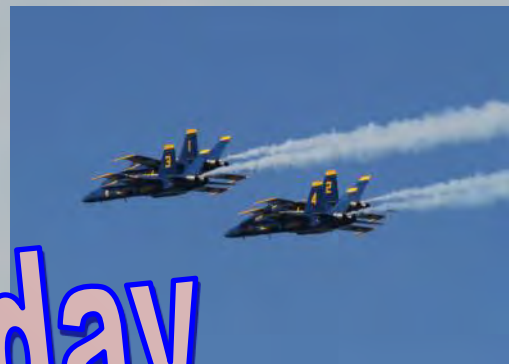
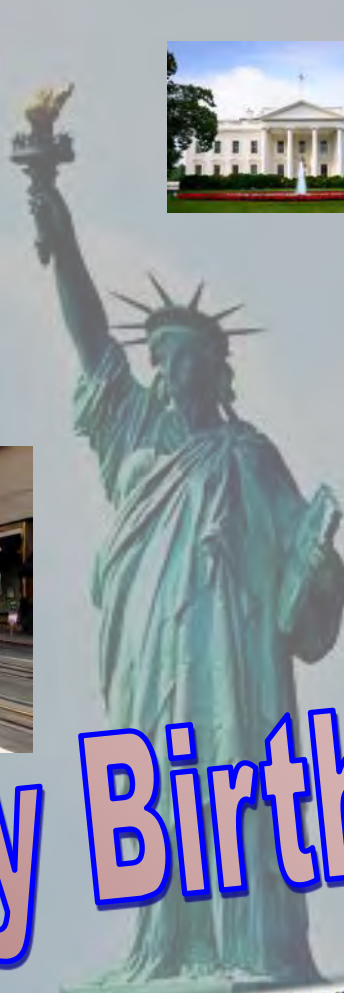
Wednesday, July 8 at 8:45 we will again meet at Sarasota National Cemetery for a “No Veteran Forgotten” ceremony.

The Pledge Of Allegiance

The author writes: "When I was a small boy in Indiana, I heard, I think, one of the most outstanding speeches I ever heard in my life. I think it compares with the 'Sermon on the Mount' and 'Lincoln's Gettysburg Address'. We had just finished reciting the Pledge of Allegiance and the principal called us all together and said, 'Uh, boys and girls, I have been listening to you recite the Pledge of Allegiance all semester, and it seems that it has become monotonous to you. Or could it be, you do not understand the meaning of each word? If I may, I would like to recite the pledge, and give you a definition for each word:

I - Me; an individual; a committee of one.

Pledge - Dedicate all of my worldly goods to give without self-pity.

Allegiance - My love and my devotion.

To the Flag - Our standard. "Old Glory"; a symbol of courage. And wherever she waves, there is respect, because your loyalty has given her a dignity that shouts "Freedom is everybody's job."

Of the United - That means we have all come together.

States - Individual communities that have united into 50 great states; 50 individual communities with pride and dignity and purpose; all divided by imaginary boundaries, yet limited to a common cause, and that's love of country.

Of America - Our home: where we live and breath, love and laugh.

And to the Republic - A republic: a sovereign state in which power is invested into the representatives chosen by the people to govern; and the government is the people; and it's from the people to the leaders, not from the leaders to the people.

For which it stands – It stands for all of us and all our freedoms.

One Nation - Meaning “so blessed by God.”

Under God - Our Creator; the Just Judge, who loves us all.

Indivisible - Incapable of being divided.

With Liberty - Which is freedom; the right of power for one to live his life without fears, threats, or any sort of retaliation.

And Justice - The principle and qualities of dealing fairly with others.

For all - For all; that means it is as much your country as it is mine”.

Supreme Knight Patrick Kelly received the John Cardinal O'Connor Award from the Sisters of Life at a gala honoring their founder, the late Cardinal John O'Connor, in Rye, New York, on June 5.

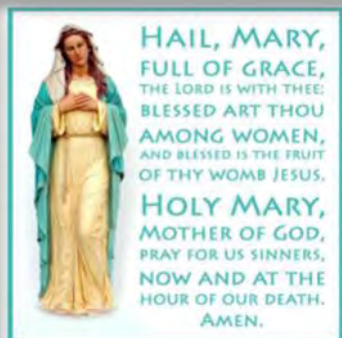
"It is a great honor this evening to receive this award on behalf of the Knights of Columbus. It is doubly meaningful because of who it comes from, and in whose memory it's named," Supreme Knight Kelly said. "His Eminence John Cardinal O'Connor was a towering pillar of the pro-life movement. With an unshakable resolve, he dedicated so much of his ministry as bishop to proclaiming the sanctity of every human life, made in the image and likeness of God. From the pulpit of St. Patrick's Cathedral and from the platform that is the Archdiocese of New York, he truly was a great prophet of the culture of life."

The supreme knight noted the longstanding partnership between the Order and the Sisters of Life, highlighting Villa Maria Guadalupe, a retreat center in Stamford, Connecticut, established by the Knights of Columbus and entrusted to the Sisters in 2004 in fulfillment of Cardinal O'Connor's vision of a place dedicated to prayer, healing and renewal. He also pointed to Life Fest, the annual youth rally cosponsored by the Order and the Sisters of Life, which for the past several years has brought together thousands of young people for prayer, worship and pro-life witness before the March for Life in Washington, D.C.

"The Knights of Columbus works with all sorts of organizations. But there is no partnership that we cherish more than our close friendship with the Sisters of Life," Supreme Knight Kelly said.

"Speaking for the Knights, we will keep doing everything we can to support the Sisters of Life, and to protect vulnerable mothers and their children. As we prepare for the work ahead, we take comfort in the knowledge that Jesus Christ will continue to guide us."
