Novena of Masses for Life



The 2025 Novena of Masses for Life began on the Feast of the Annunciation, Tuesday, March 25th at the 11 AM Mass. The May Novena mass will be celebrated at the 11AM Mass on Sunday, May 25th.

The Incarnation Council is partnering with the Incarnation Women's Club once again to provide the stipend for the 2025 Novena of Masses for Life.

Sarasota Medical Pregnancy Center (SMPC)



Brother Art Reilly serves as an ambassador and Committee member for Sarasota Medical Pregnancy Center in a variety of capacities. During April among other things, he

- Chaired the SMPC Board's April 21st Medical and Educational Services Committee meeting and participated with staff and others in related activities.
- Participated in teleconference calls with ICU Mobile to develop the basis for a recommendation to the SMPC Board for support in planning, training and ongoing operational support for the 26-foot Mobile Unit that the Center will be receiving from the State of Florida in the next few months. Initially, it will be used to perform high-

definition, 4-D ultrasound exams at remote locations and intake new clients for other Center services.

- Conducted two tours of the Pregnancy Center with local civic and health leaders to show them the facilities and capabilities, introduce them to Center staff, and review the Center services that help moms, babies and families during a challenging time in their lives when they need someone to walk with them and let them know that they are not alone.
- Attended the monthly Newtown Community Ministries United Prayer Service on April 18th (photo shown of Pastor Wesley Tunstall and choir), the Good Friday Sarasota Stations of the Cross down Main Street to The Church of Redeemer (photo shown). and the Jewish Community Center's Interfaith Roundtable on April 30th.
- Toured Truly Valued (school for at-risk youth) at Sarasota's Booker Middle School and Dreamer's Academy (a Sarasota bilingual Charter school in Newtown) and discussed with their leaders possible collaborations to work with their staff, parents, students and the community more broadly to inform, educate and counsel in areas of risk avoidance/prevention and potentially intervention in a future community services resource center being contemplated.
- Led the initial implementation of an SMPC process in which a Center supporter donated an auto through a new not-for-profit, Miracle Motors, to a Center client with significant family-need of an auto for attending to job, health and educational needs. Miracle Motors has resources to

check-out and even do relatively minor work on an auto to get into good working order. Facilitating this initial process of transferring an auto from a donor to a needy client establishes a model/capability for handling other such donations in the future.

- Served also on the SMPC Board's Governance and the Board's Finance Committee meeting.





Mothers' Day Rose Sale for Solve Maternity Homes



Brother Art has coordinated with Solve Maternity Homes for them to provide 500 long-stem roses for the Annual Incarnation Mothers' Day Rose Sale that will be held at all Sunday Masses on Saturday, May 10th and Sunday, May 11th. The roses will be sold for \$3 each and two for \$5. All proceeds will go to the Solve Maternity Homes of Sarasota and Manatee Counties to help support the women and babies that live in their four homes.

Solve will celebrate its 50th Anniversary in 2026 and may well provide the first home for its 1,500th baby that same year. Approximately 1,460 babies have been welcomed into this world at a Solve Home as of now.






