Chaplains Message

CHAPLAIN'S MESSAGE -

Dear brother knights,

I hope this newsletter finds you well. As many of you already know, October is not only the month dedicated to the Most Holy Rosary but it is also Respect Life Month. It is the season of the Church in which we reflect upon the sacredness of every human life, from conception to natural death because every human life is made in the Image and Likeness of God himself, and personally formed and created by Him, thus having irrevocable dignity and deserving of respect.

On the other hand, it is the month of the Rosary because it is the month in which the Battle of Lepanto was fought. On October 7th of 1571, there was a naval battle fought between a coalition of European Catholics and the Ottoman Empire. The battle was against impossible odds and nobody believed the Turkish armada could be beaten. Pope St. Pius V called all the churches to be open day and night and everyone to pray the rosary ceaselessly. If we lost, all of Western Christendom would have fallen and we would all likely be Muslim today. A true miracle happened and we won. Pope Pius V then declared October 7th to be the feast of the Holy Rosary and dedicated the entire month to it. Our enemy is no longer the Ottoman empire, but the snares and temptations of the Devil.

My dear brother knights, let us renew our devotion to the daily recitation of the rosary for protection for our families, for our country, and the world at large, and pray for an ever greater awareness of the sacredness and dignity of life in our world and in our country. Know you remain in my prayers and I pray you have a most blessed month of October.

POPE LEO'S MESSAGE TO THE K OF C:

Pope Leo XIV recently greeted the Knights of Columbus with a video message during their 143rd Supreme Convention in Washington, D.C. The Pope encouraged the Knights to be "Heralds of Hope" during the Jubilee Year of Hope, a sentiment echoed by the Knights' commitment to the legacy of their founder, Blessed Michael McGivney.

OCTOBER IS DEDICATED TO THE ROSARY -

The feast of Our Lady of the Rosary, also celebrated as Our Lady of Victory or Victories, was established by Pope St. Pius V in 1571 to celebrate the miraculous victory of the Christian forces in the Battle of Lepanto on Oct. 7 of that year. Previous to the decisive battle, St. Pius V had requested all Western Christians to pray the rosary; thus he attributed the victory to the power of the Marian prayer rather than the power of ships and cannons.

Two years before establishing the feast, in 1569, Pope St. Pius V officially approved the rosary in its present form with the papal bull *Consueverunt Romani Pontifices* ("The Roman Pontiffs are accustomed," the first words of the document). In a development from earlier methods of praying the rosary, the new version included the second half of the Hail Mary, as well as the "Glory Be" prayer at the end of each mystery.

The dedication of the month of October to the Holy Rosary became common in the Church thanks to Pope Leo XIII, an enthusiastic promoter of the rosary. In the span of only five years, Pope Leo wrote eleven encyclicals on the rosary.

St. John Paul II called the rosary his favorite prayer, "in which we meditate with Mary upon the mysteries which she as a Mother meditated on in her heart (Lk. 2:19.)."

- Mary, Mother of God, with her Knights for the sanctity of human life in all stages.
- Mary, heart of the Holy Family, with her Knights, for faithful marriages and joyful families.
- Mary the Immaculate Conception, with her Knights, for decency and purity in our world.
- Mary, to whom her son would refuse nothing, with her Knights, for justice and compassion for the downtrodden and all those who suffer.

RIGHT TO LIFE MINISTRY -

The Fall 40 Days for Life campaign kicks off.

For the next 40 days faithful who are united in protecting unborn children from the scourge of abortion will be standing in peaceful vigil in front of abortion facilities praying for the unborn, their parents, and for an end to abortion in Florida and the United States.

The Diocese of Venice hosts three 40 Days for Life fall campaign vigil sites in Naples, Fort Myers and Sarasota. These sites are among 650 nationwide which will be manned each day from Sept. 24, 2025, through Nov. 2.

Thanks to the encouragement of Bishop Frank J. Dewane, since 40 Days for Life began in 2007, the Diocese of Venice has been an active participant. During that time, nationwide, 25,695 mothers have chosen life for their children; 274 abortion workers have quit their jobs; and 181 abortion centers where 40 Days for Life vigils have been held, have gone out of business.

40 Days for Life and 40 Days For Life 365:

For the last 8 years, our STM Knights, along with STM Parishioner's spend one full day in one hour increments to pray outside Sarasota's Regional Planned Parenthood location on 736 Central Ave in downtown Sarasota. We also have been dedicated in our efforts to join the 40 Days for Life 365 worldwide initiative with other parishes, Knights groups and have committed to pray at Planned Parenthood each month on the 4th Thursday from 9AM to 1PM.

STM Defenders of Life by Brian Harkins, Maureen and I went to the 40 Days kickoff in Syracuse NY this week. We joined about 50 faithful prayer warriors who have persevered for 34 years to close the Planned Parenthood facility there. Notoriously, this location is where the first "legal abortion" took place in the USA on July 1st 1970 after Governor Rockefeller signed it into NY State law (3 years before Roe vs Wade became a federal law.

We were struck by the joy this group exhibited! Both of the inspirational leaders of this 40 DFL location have 6 and 8 children respectively - Wow! They spoke about the interactions they had with people going into Planned Parenthood as "divine appointments ". They also spoke about the importance of asking the Holy Spirit for patience and kindness before they arrived to spend one hour during the 40 Days vigil.

They strongly encouraged fellow defenders to come often and bring a friend. Remember Planned Parenthood has consolidated in FL. and are on the ropes without federal funding for one year.

Neil and I encourage you to make your presence felt in Sarasota. You are instruments of God's presence and peace and thru you - miracles happen with babies and families preserved.


